Loghouse school operated on reserve

**1952**

Loss of Veteran land

**1964**

First Nations given the vote

**1966**

Highway and bridge built



**1876**

Treaty 6 signed

**1967**

Residential school no longer run by the Catholic Church



**1968**

Residential Schools taken over by INAC

**1969**

The White Paper (amendment to Indian Act)

**1970**

NIFI/TRM/SIIT & First Flying Dust Pow Wow held



**1971**

Running water brought to Flying Dust

Flying Dust Ball League established



**1980**

Chief Cornerstone Radio Show began

**1981**

Learning Centre opened & playground built



**1988**

Flying Dust gymnasium opened



**1994**

Specific claim for CPR lands submitted

**1995**

Beauval Residential School closed

**1997**

CFDM Radio Station started

**2000**

Headstart/Preschool began, Flying Dust School expanded (k-3), SPM partnership with province began & Bob's Fuel opened

**2001**

Joint school agreement signed

**2005**

Flying Dust Pow Wow reinstated

**2006**

CCBP Pilot Project began

**2011**

Hockey arena opened



**2007**

Family Learning Centre established & construction of the Flying Dust Corporate Complex Began

Community Plan completed & Residential School survivors began to receive compensation

**2015**

Specific claim validated for CPR lands

**2006**

Elders Lodge opens



**1975**

New church built, outdoor rink constructed & MLTC formed



**1985**

Bill C31 passed, new band office built & band controlled education began

**1983**

Flying Dust Village created & carpentry program began

**1982**

New access road opened

**1993**

Treaty Land Entitlement Framework agreement signed

**1992**

Constitution changed & Flying Dust Daycare established



**1998**

Junior subdivision built & kindergarten started



**2004**

Kopahawakenum School opened & outdoor classroom completed



**2003**

Summer games hosted, Memorial Ballpark developed, Provincial building constructed, Youth Centre open & USIC Pilot Project completed
